From world famous rum to jewelry made from the island's legendary pink sand, Bermuda's unique products make for perfect gifts and souvenirs. The island's DIY scene is vibrant, authentic and eclectic, offering a wide array of only-in-Bermuda styles, flavors and items.

Apparel

- <u>TABS (The Authentic Bermuda Short)</u> Born-and-bred Bermudian Rebecca Hanson has reclaimed a classic island look and given Bermuda shorts a fashion-forward spin. Made out of high quality, comfortable cotton twill, each pair is stylish, playful and colourful just like the island itself.
- <u>DBA: Designs by Alshanté</u> The dazzlingly colorful, hand-painted designs of Alshante Foggo have gained an international following – R&B superstar Chris Brown has even commissioned a custom pair of Timberland shoes from her. She offers swimwear, footwear, textiles, prints and more.
- <u>Coral Coast Clothing</u> Founded by native Bermudians Sam Outerbridge and Adam Petty, Coral Coast Clothing blends vibrant Bermuda hues with classic tailoring for a sophisticated, "dress to impress" style. The pair donates a portion of every sale to nonprofit organizations in Bermuda who are dedicated to saving the island's coral reefs.
- **Barbara Finsness Signature Collection** Bermudian artist Barbara Finsness produces beautiful silk ties and scarves (among many other products) available at the Island Shop in Hamilton, the Fairmont Southampton and the Town of St. George.

Food & Beverage

- <u>Gosling's Rum</u> With a history stretching back to the early 19th century, Gosling's Black Seal Rum is the key ingredient in Bermuda's two signature cocktails, the Dark 'n Stormy and the Rum Swizzle, not to mention Bermuda's famed fish chowder.
- **Barritt's Bermuda Stone Ginger Beer** Bermuda's soft drink of choice since 1874, Barritt's is a zesty and refreshing beverage that can be enjoyed all on its own or mixed with rum, vodka, beer or exotic liqueurs.
- <u>Chiko's Smokey Rub</u> Michiko Campbell, Sous-Chef de Cuisine at the Royal Bermuda Yacht Club, is the creator of a popular brand of seasoning called Chiko's Smokey Rub, which adds a marvelous flavor to chicken, beef, pork, and seafood, as well as a host of other recipes.
- <u>Devil's Isle Coffee</u> Coffee lovers should make a beeline to Devil's Isle Coffee, where an award-winning roaster hand roasts and expertly blends 100% Arabica beans using a "small batch" process that brings out unique flavour profiles.
- **Outerbridge's Original Sherry Peppers** This island staple is known for its role in Bermuda fish chowder, but it's capable of adding flavor and fire to all kinds of grilled foods.

- Horton's Bermuda Rum Cake Horton's legendary rum cakes are the ultimate Bermuda dessert. Linda Horton's recipe (secret, of course) has been imitated countless times, but never matched they're light, buttery, moist and magnificent.
- <u>Tucker's Farm Goat Cheese</u> Tucker's Farm has quickly made a name for itself on island, thanks to its fresh and flavorful cheeses, including the spicy Full Hot variety, made with Gosling's Black Seal Rum and hot peppers.
- <u>Alex & Pete's Bermuda Artisan Ice Cream</u> Since launching in 2014, Alex & Pete's new line of handcrafted ice cream has been winning raves, thanks to its delicious Bermuda-inspired flavours. Pick from such enticing varieties as St. George's Black Rum & Ginger, Riddell's Bay Chocolate Ripple, Southampton Sea Salt Caramel, or Rum Swizzle, made with Outerbridge's Original Bermuda Rum Swizzle Mix.
- <u>Bermuda Jam Factory</u> The Bermuda Jam Factory's Bermuda Gombey Pepper Jams (named for the island's famously colourful Gombey dancers) bring sweet heat to any recipe, whether it's mouthwatering mini burgers, glazed salmon or just crackers and Cotswold cheddar.

Gifts & Accessories

- <u>Alexandra Mosher Studio Jewelry</u> Alexandra Mosher puts a little bit of Bermuda into everything she makes often literally. Her Reef collection features the island's legendary pink coral sand fused into beautiful earrings, rings and bracelets.
- **Dockyard Glassworks** Since 1999, this studio and glass gallery has been producing handmade glass art in various styles such as sculptural glass, flameworking, blown glass and jewelry. Visitors can enjoy the vibrant, swirling colours up close and personal by watching the glassblowers at work in the studio.
- <u>Lili Bermuda Perfumery</u> Perfumer Isabelle Ramsay-Brackstone's line of perfumes, Lili Bermuda, creates intoxicating, handcrafted fragrances inspired by the island's natural beauty – think Bermuda cedarwood, spring freesias and luscious loquats. Guests can even create their own signature scent at one of the perfumery's workshops.
- **<u>Rebecca Little Jewelry</u>** A born-and-bred Bermudian, Rebecca Little designs and handcrafts each and every one of her lovely pieces, taking inspiration from the island's vibrant colors, as well as its unique architecture. She's even created a collection that nods cheekily at the infamous Bermuda Triangle.
- **Bermuda Candle Company** Launched in 2014 by the husband-and-wife team of Shannon and Lindsey Philpott, the Bermuda Candle Company has become an island favourite thanks to its recycled glass jars, clean burning soy wax blend, and wonderful, Bermuda-inspired fragrances.
- **Bermuda Clayworks** A collective of local studio potters & ceramic artists in the Royal Naval Dockyard, Clayworks offers a diverse range of professional pottery in a unique historical setting. The Gallery features the work of several independent onsite artists with the addition of work by other local ceramicists.
- **DavidRose Jewelry** DavidRose's husband and wife team David and Rose create Bridal jewelry, one-of-a-kind statement pieces, and Luxury Silver Jewelry. Their design studio in the historic Town of St. George is open to the public.
- <u>Bermuda Cedar Gifts</u> The iconic Bermuda cedar tree a cornerstone of island life for more than four centuries is put to good use by Bermuda Cedar Gifts, a company that creates handcrafted pens, razors, wine stoppers and more. A perfect gift.
- **Isolated Surf Boards** Handcrafted in Bermuda by Cullen O'Hara, Isolated Surf Boards is the island's primary source for surfboards, SUPs, ding repair, lessons, tours and accessories.

Where To Shop

- <u>Atelerie</u> Located in the City of Hamilton, the Atelerie Boutique offers a painstakingly curated selection of the finest in women's apparel and jewelry, including both Bermudian and international brands.
- <u>Bermuda Craft Market</u> This lively spot in the Royal Naval Dockyard is the best place to experience Bermuda's thriving DIY scene. You'll find the perfect souvenirs here ranging from candles, Bermuda cedar, notecards, pink sand sculptures, and more and you might even buy them from the artisans themselves.
- <u>Urban Cottage</u> This Hamilton shop is filled with a retro-futurist blend of fresh, locally made products (the urban) and timeworn, vintage Bermuda items (the cottage). Urban Cottage's mastermind, <u>Nicole Golden Brown</u>, is always discovering unique treasures.
- **Bermuda Arts Centre** Highlighting the diversity of Bermuda's creative community, the revolving exhibits at Bermuda Arts Centre (located in the Royal Naval Dockyard) showcase the best local artists.
- <u>The Island Shop</u> With three on-island locations in Hamilton, the Fairmont Southampton Resort and St. George's, The Island Shop features original artwork designs on ceramics and linens by Bermudian artist Barbara Finsness.

Travel Tips

- Every visitor (regardless of age) may import duty free alcoholic beverages not exceeding one liter of spirits and one liter of wine.
- Visitors may import gifts to a total value of \$30.00 duty free provided that the goods accompany them on arrival and provided further that the goods are intended as a gift for another person and not for resale.
- Canned, preserved or frozen fruits and vegetables may be imported by travellers in any quantities.
