

Bermuda Safety Tips

As your personal safety is very important to us, we encourage you to exercise a few safety precautions during your stay

Be Knowledgeable

Review the Property checklist which should include:

Property Manager contact details

Property Rules & Guidelines

How to:

- Use all appliances
- Open/close/lock windows and doors
- Operate the supplied phone within the unit

What to do in case of an emergency

- Location of fire extinguisher
- Exit plan

General information on the neighbourhood and Bermuda Transportation options

- Taxi contact information
- Bus schedule highlighting closest route(s) to the property

Be Clear

Who can you expect to see on the property? Where and why! This may include someone to clean/refresh, landscapers, or general property maintenance personnel.

Be Mindful

Make use of any safe keeping facilities the property supplies.

When leaving the property secure all doors and windows

At night, close curtains/blinds and secure windows and patio doors.

If using a rental vehicle, take your personal items like beach bags or cameras with you, unless they are secured with a safety device, when you park the vehicle.

If utilising a private pool or beach facilities or going to one of our many public beaches, leave your valuable items secured at the property's safe keeping facilities.

Be Aware

When using bank ATM machines alone or at night to withdraw large sums of cash, as a precaution, be wary of strangers who may be standing close by.

Ladies: When shopping, attend to your handbag. Place your purse or handbag under your left or right arm – whichever side is farthest from the traffic when walking about.

Fellas: Divide your cash between your pockets and take care from putting your wallet in your back pockets. Please attend to your briefcase/laptop in public areas.

Know the contents of your purse or wallet, i.e., amount of money, denominations, driver's licence and personal items. In the unlikely event of lost or stolen items, they can be easily identified.

Be Safe

It is illegal to use, or have in your possession, any illegal substance in Bermuda as we have ZERO tolerance in relation to the use of illegal drugs.

Crime in Bermuda is relatively low in comparison to similar jurisdictions, but it is always recommended to take security precautions when travelling to new destinations.
